New Forest Nightstop voted as best UK charity in National Lottery Awards 2012

2012 was an exceptional year in the long history of New Forest Nightstop. We celebrated our 10th anniversary, joining with the nation's Olympic celebrations with our very own torchbearer and rounding it all off by being voted in as the nation's best charity in the National Lottery Awards.

But how did we nearly triple this to win the prestigious national award with just one member of staff and 30 volunteers? It was a huge community success, with everyone taking those few simple minutes to tell a friend, pass it on and click to vote; a team win!

After being been shortlisted from 500 charities, our friends and fans voted us through the semifinals into the top 3 finalists with 1960 votes. Through a busy 6 months from start to finish, New Forest Nightstop & our supporters far and wide, promoted, publicised and campaigned to gain the landslide national win of 5790 votes.

It was a privilege for the few of us that travelled to London to receive the award on behalf of Nightstop, live, in front of 8 million

viewers. We were given the prime spot striking film of the night, featured first with our powerful and. There were many tears across the studio floor from celebrities, Olympians and friends and we received countless congratulations and good wishes afterwards.

We won the prestigious award and a £2000 prize and achieved enormous publicity through being featured in the Daily Telegraph, several features on BBC Radio Solent, 3 national TV appearances and across all local press.

The response has been overwhelming with many genuine enquiries from people local & national, who want to make a difference. Being part of a national network of 40 Nightstops across the UK means we have been able to direct enquiries to their nearest service.

New Forest Nightstop would like to express its sincerest thanks to everyone who has met with and supported us in 2012.

"When I became homeless I felt lonely and like I had nowhere to sleep and no one to look after me. Adjusting to having no home was difficult. Nightstop gave me an option whilst my accommodation got properly sorted, giving me one less thing to think about.

The hosts were welcoming, kind & generous people and stopped me from thinking about being homeless; they gave me a lot and asked for nothing in return. Nightstop is a safe place to be in; it helps give stability to a young person's life. Staying with New Forest Nightstop helped me to realise how great a job the Nightstop volunteers do. I now have a home and am able to continue my college course."

Kerry continues to study art at college and has even donated her talents to New Forest Nightstop by designing a unique set of Christmas card designs. For the first time ever, Nightstop had a beautifully packaged set of cards to sell to our supporters. The designs by Kerry were all created around her concept of a 'Christmas bed' and her story is on the back. A joint project between Kerry, Nightstop and Deacon Insurance, gave us a wonderful way to spread the word of our work and help to raise funds but at the end of the day, Kerry was the key!

Joining with our National Lottery Awards campaign, TCSU organised and hosted a whole day of collecting votes for us. Geared up with sashes, banners and voting sheets, they devoted the day to speaking to other students in the canteens, classrooms and even across their social media networks. 350 votes were collected on paper but word spread online and the students played a great part in our success. Deacon Frightstop for Nightstop




